### DO I NEED URGENT CARE?

The **Annapolis Urgent Treatment Centre** provides access to care for those with unexpected, but non-life-threatening health concerns with appointments offered within one to two days. **Patients will be seen by appointment only.**

Urgent treatment centres are different than emergency departments. They offer another option for care for those who do not have a life-threatening medical emergency but require urgent treatment. Annapolis Urgent Treatment Centre is for patients without a primary care provider, and those who have a primary care provider but are unable to access same day/next day appointments.



### Go to the urgent treatment centre for the following:

- ✓ mild abdominal pain
- ✓ simple fractures
- ✓ limb sprains
- ✓ mild muscle strains/sprains
- ✓ mild headaches
- ✓ earaches
- ✓ minor infections
- ✓ skin and eye irritations
- ✓ mild asthma
- ✓ small lacerations
- ✓ mild mental health support
- ✓ minor respiratory issues



### DO I NEED EMERGENCY CARE?

Patients with potentially life-threatening conditions should immediately call 911. Emergency departments address the most serious and life-threatening health issues.

#### Call 911 for the following:

- ✓ stroke/facial weakness
- ✓ new onset of weakness
- ✓ heart attack/chest pain or tightness
- ✓ unable to wake/unconscious
- ✓ sudden onset of severe headache or confusion
- ✓ seizure and/or severe head injury
- ✓ major assault
- ✓ severe difficulty breathing or trouble speaking
- ✓ uncontrolled or severe bleeding
- ✓ major trauma such as loss of limb or laceration
- ✓ severe allergic reaction
- ✓ severe burns
